PERSONAL STATEMENT

I am a Consultant Gynaecological Oncologist with subspecialist accreditation in Obstetrics and Gynaecology and over a decade of senior clinical experience in complex cancer surgery and multidisciplinary care. My practice encompasses the diagnosis and management of cervical, endometrial, ovarian and vulval malignancies, advanced cytoreductive surgery, hereditary cancer risk management, and the governance of cancer pathways within a large UK teaching hospital.

From the outset of my medical career, I have maintained a strong academic and professional interest in ethics, law and patient communication. I completed an intercalated BSc in Bioethics followed by a Master's degree in Health Ethics and Law, which has provided a structured framework for analysing consent, capacity, professional standards, duty of care and complex decision-making. This academic foundation underpins my medico-legal work and informs my approach to balanced, evidence-based expert opinion. I have completed Bond Solon courses on Report Writing for Expert Witnesses, Court Room skills & Civil Law and Procedure for Expert Witnesses.

I have served as Lead Clinician for Gynaecological Cancer and currently hold the role of Lead Cancer Clinician within my Trust. These leadership positions have required detailed scrutiny of clinical pathways, guideline compliance, audit data, morbidity and mortality review, and quality assurance processes. I have led the development and revision of tumour-specific operational policies, consent documentation, and patient information materials, and have overseen service redesign to meet national and European quality standards. Under my leadership, our unit achieved European certification for advanced ovarian cancer surgery and has demonstrated high regional survival outcomes.

I am actively involved in national governance and guideline development through the British Gynaecological Cancer Society, contributing to national guidance and audit programmes. My publication record includes peer-reviewed research in surgical outcomes, performance indicators, benchmarking methodology and standards of care in gynaecological oncology. I regularly review manuscripts for leading journals and contribute to the appraisal of clinical evidence at a national level. This work ensures my opinions are grounded in current literature, national guidance and contemporary practice.

My clinical practice includes high-complexity surgery, peri-operative risk assessment, multidisciplinary treatment planning, and the management of complications. I am experienced in analysing documentation, evaluating adherence to standards, and assessing causation in complex oncological pathways. I understand the importance of clarity, objectivity and independence in medico-legal reporting and am committed to producing structured, balanced and defensible expert reports for the Court.
